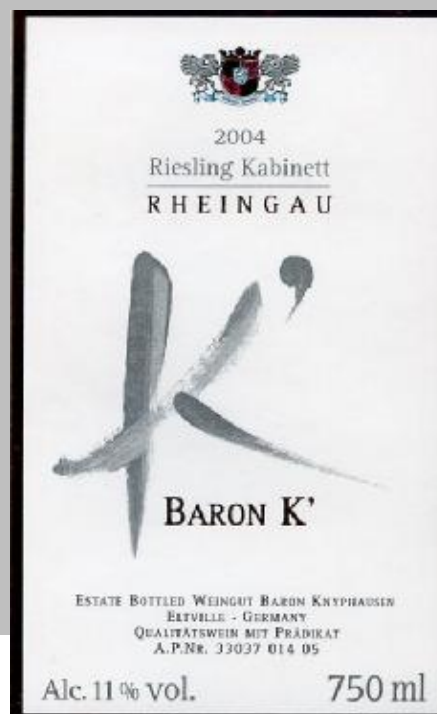


Baron zu Knyphausen-Rheingau



- Wine:** 2004 „Baron K“ Riesling Kabinett KN2-04
- Producer:** The Knyphausens have been wine growers since 1818. Their estate in Eberbach, however, dates from 1141, when it was founded by Cistercian monks from Eberbach monastery.
- Region / Vineyards:** The Rheingau, a small and compact region, runs from east to west parallel to the Rhine's 20 mile deviation from its northern course. The vineyards line the slopes between the protective Taunus hills and the heat-reflecting surface of the Rhine.
- Vintage:** In 2004 nature made up for the unusual hot previous year by bringing back a refreshingly normal harvest. Bud break, flowering and fruit set all occurred at dates close to the longterm average. Good weather early October ensured fully ripe and healthy grapes with an excellent ripeness level, very pure fruit flavors and perfectly balanced acidity.
- Taste Profile:** A fullbodied, fruity wine with lots of minerals, decent sweetness and a well balanced acidity with a long lasting aftertaste.
- Pairings:** Combine it with lobster and turkey.
- Wine Profile:** Alc. by Vol.: 11 %, residual sugar: 2.63 % (26.3 g/l), acidity: 0.8 % (8.0 g/l)
Grape variety: 100 % Riesling

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
