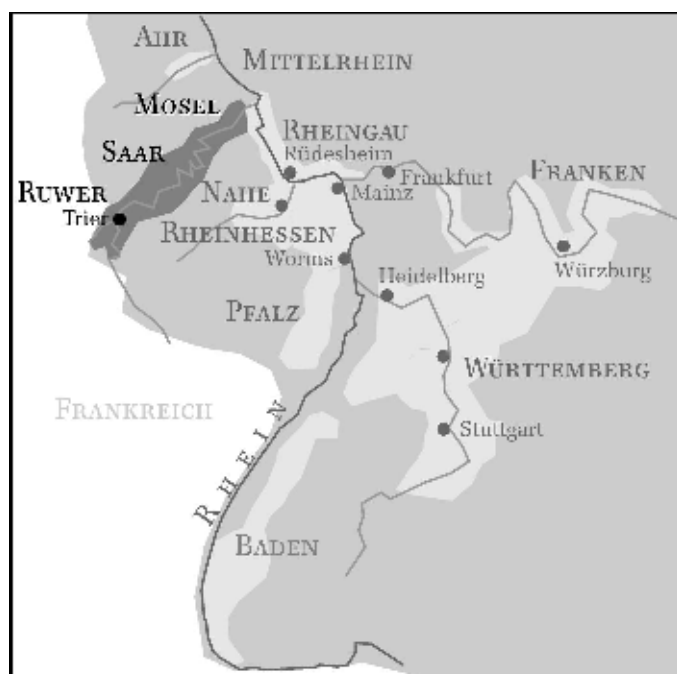


Weingut Dr. Loosen – Mosel-Saar-Ruwer



Wine:	2004 Dr. L Riesling QbA	DL6-04
Producer: □	The Loosen family, proprietor of the famed Dr. Loosen Estate, is one of Germany's finest producers and has been the subject of many international wine articles and of Janois Robinson's BBC Wine Course. Loosen Bros. believe in low yield of fully ripened grapes selectively harvested in October and November.	
Region / Vineyards:	This wine is made out of the traditional steep vineyards of the Mosel-Saar-Ruwer region. The soil is of deeply weathered Devonian slate, with small quantities of loam and clay.	
Vintage:	In 2004 nature made up for the unusual hot previous year by bringing back a refreshingly normal harvest. Bud break, flowering and fruit set all occurred at dates close to the longterm average. Good weather early October ensured fully ripe and healthy grapes with an excellent ripeness level, very pure fruit flavors and perfectly balanced acidity.	
Taste Profile:	A wonderful Riesling with fresh aromas of peach, very fruity with a little bit of spritz, therefore very refreshing and also with a good concentration.	
Pairings:	To be drunk together with fish and shellfish, salty or strong blue cheese, white meat and wonderful with spicy or hot Asian cuisine, but also an ideal summer wine or apéritif with only around 8.5 % vol.
