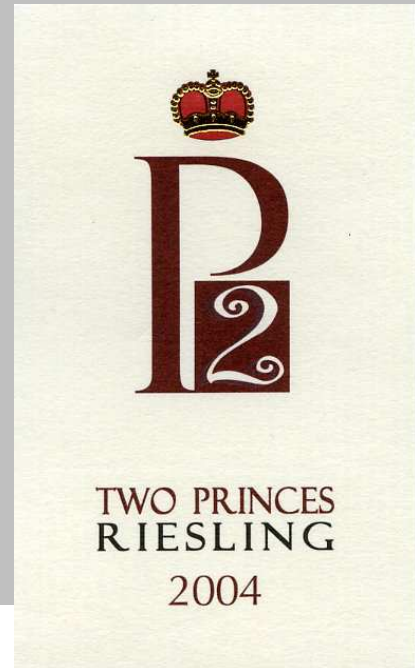
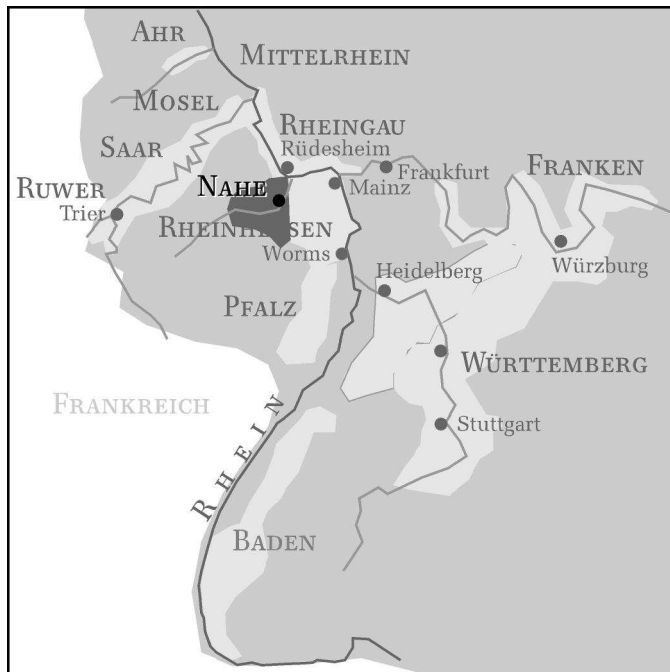


## Prinz zu Salm-Dalberg'sches Weingut - Nahe



- Wine:** 2004 "Two Princes" P2 PS29-04
- Producer:** Schloss Wallhausen is one of Germany's oldest traditional wine estates. Prinz zu Salm, the estate owner and current president of the VdP (Association of Prädikat Wine Estates), can trace his family tree back to 932 and his vineyards to 1200.
- Region/Vineyards:** The Nahe vineyards are scattered among the fields and orchards of the Hunsrück hills and the Soonwald forest, situated between the Rhine and Mosel valleys.  
"Two Princes" P2 is the signature wine of Prince Michael and Prince Constantin zu Salm-Salm, members of the 31<sup>st</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> generation of winegrowers at his family's estate Schloss Wallhausen.
- Vintage:** In 2004 nature made up for the unusual hot previous year by bringing back a refreshingly normal harvest. Bud break, flowering and fruit set all occurred at dates close to the longterm average. Good weather early October ensured fully ripe and healthy grapes with an excellent ripeness level, very pure fruit flavors and perfectly balanced acidity.
- Taste Profile:** P2 displays a perfect balance between sweetness, acidity and minerality. Delicate flowers of apricot and nectarine, with a lovely, crisp finish.
- Pairings:** This wine can be drunk with all sorts of starters, seafood and white meat or simply on its own.
- Wine Profile:** Alc. by Vol.: 9,0 %, residual sugar: 4,62 % (46,2 g/l), acidity: 0.85 % (8,5 g/l)  
Grape variety: 100 % Riesling
