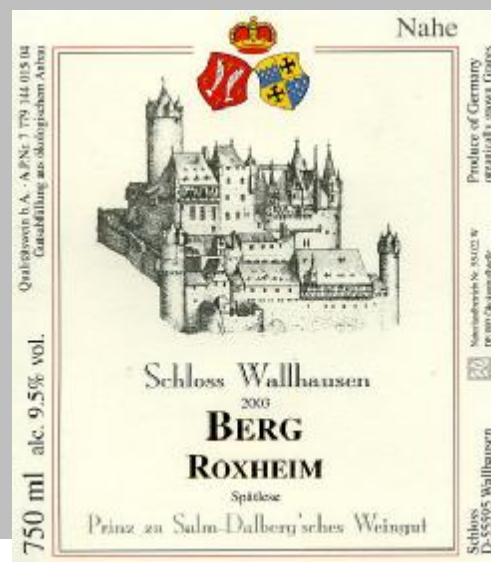
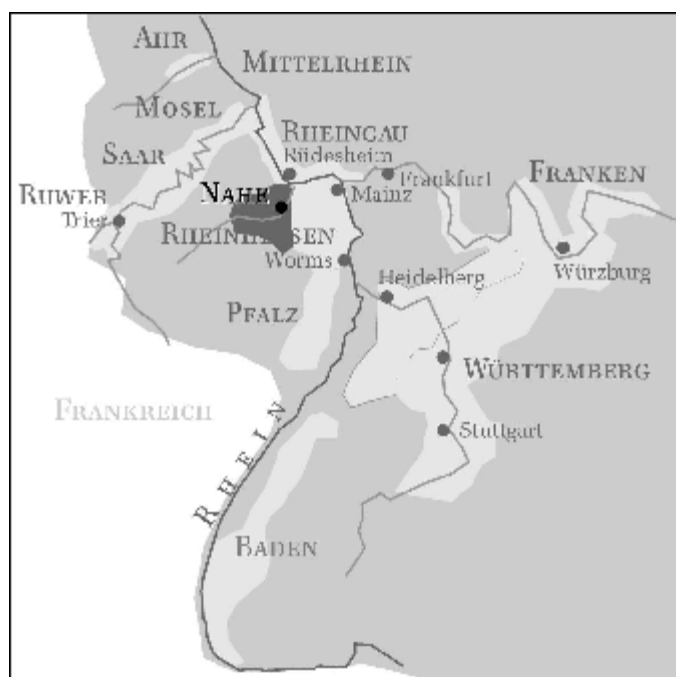


Prinz zu Salm-Dalberg'sches Weingut - Nahe



Wine: 2003 Roxheimer Berg Riesling Spätlese

Producer: Schloss Wallhausen is one of Germany's oldest traditional wine estates. Prinz zu Salm, the estate owner and current president of the VdP (Association of Prädikat Wine Estates), can trace his family tree back to 932 and his vineyards to 1200.

Region/Vineyards: The Nahe vineyards are scattered among the fields and orchards of the Hunsrück hills and the Soonwald forest, situated between the Rhine and Mosel valleys. The Roxheimer Berg is one of the estate's top sites. The grapes grow on red steep (60 %) slopes. These grapes bring forward very strong and telling Rieslings.

Vintage: A winter with plenty of rain combined with the warm early spring days set off rapid and luxuriant vegetation. One of the hottest and driest summers since 100 years followed. Harvest was well ahead 2 – 3 weeks and rewarded vintners with an exceptionally good vintage.

Taste Profile: The grapes for this wine were selected on very high criteria. They had to be fully ripe and still healthy. This brought forward a fine wine which astonishes with its natural sweetness harmonizing perfectly with its lively acidity and a hint of mineral notes.

Pairings: It fits well with spicy dishes of the Asian cuisine or with desserts, but the best way to enjoy this wine is simply on its own to round up special evenings.

Wine Profile: Alc. by Vol.: 9.5 %, residual sugar: 7.09 % (70.9 g/l), acidity: 0.78 % (7.8 g/l)
Grape variety: 100 % Riesling *Organically grown grapes!*

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
